President's report

We are pleased to present this annual report that provides a summary of CDH Australia's activities and financial results for the financial year 2016-17.

The board refined and focused our strategic objectives to deliver our mission, and benefited from a diverse range of skills and knowledge offered by our six board members.

To continue to build infrastructure to address increased demand, we strengthened our digital capabilities with a community portal, which has webcasts and information sheets on a variety of topics.

We celebrated our fifteenth CDH Australia Annual Forum (CAAF), which was held in Adelaide for the first time. The CAAF was held at the South Australian Museum and families shared their thoughts in art therapy and small group sessions, and a beautiful memorial service.

Based on management accounts, CDH Australia's total operating revenue for the year ended 30 June 2017 was \$57,594, of which donations contributed \$33,905 and fundraising contributed \$14,830 to overall income. We registered a surplus of \$29,127 for the 2016/17 financial year. The official audited accounts will be presented in the coming weeks, and will be available on the website.

CDH Australia was fortunate to receive philanthropic grants this year that funded the CDH Australia Annual Forum. Our heartfelt thanks go to the Trustees for supporting CDH Australia.

We also gratefully acknowledge the hard work and dedication shown by families honouring their children with CDH with some significant amounts raised and donated to CDH Australia. Fundraising is critical, as our volunteer organisation could not operate without it.

We must continue to establish reliable income streams in order to be majority self-funded and sustainable into the future. We look forward to greater growth and more opportunities to collaborate in order to step closer to realising our vision and mission.

Together we can do more. No family to face CDH alone.

About us

CDH Australia is a grassroots national health promotion charity for families, friends and medical professionals affected by congenital diaphragmatic hernia (CDH).

Our vision is for no family to face CDH alone. Our mission is to improve the lives of those affected by CDH, support and advocate for families, raise awareness and support research. Our organisation is governed by a board of directors and support services are delivered by state contacts.

CDH is a rare lung disease that occurs in approximately 1 in 2,500-3000 births and remains lethal or associated with serious morbidity in a large number of cases – the devastating consequences of inadequate lung growth and development.

Strategic Priorities

The CDH Australia Board met in February for our annual strategy and planning workshop and came away with some bold aspirations:

- We want our organisation to be sustainable so we can support families in years to come
- We need to increase our reach to people affected by CDH, their carers and healthcare professionals to get the best possible outcomes for families
- We need to better support individuals born with a diaphragmatic hernia
- We want to do all we can to support research to minimise the devastating impacts of congenital diaphragmatic hernia (CDH)

The outcomes we are striving to deliver include:

- Strong, state-based network of volunteers in place and functioning collaboratively with increased male participation and formal training processes
- Connect with and understand the needs of adolescent and adult CDHers
- Assess opportunities to build relationships and leverage infrastructure of potential community, funding, advocacy and research partners
- Develop a fundraising strategy to diversify revenue streams and reach the target of being 80% self-funded to ensure long-term sustainability
- Develop a marketing and communications plan to target communications and increase community and corporate supporters
- Develop CDH Sunflower Sunday awareness day fundraiser to be a major platform for awareness raising, especially throughout hospitals, and be a significant fundraising campaign
- Continue building a library of support resources including information sheets and webcasts with specialists, researchers and allied health professionals

To get us to a position where we can deliver these goals is a big challenge for a micro-charity like CDH Australia. We need the technology, infrastructure, resources and funds of a much larger organisation and we are striving to build these in the coming years. Corporate and community support will be critical to achieve our goals.

Research and collaboration

Pilot Study

CDH Australia formally established a research fund to direct donations nominated for CDH research in 2015. In September of that year, CDH Australia donated \$30,000 to Monash University to support a pilot study into CDH fetal therapies by Dr Ryan Hodges. Dr Ryan Hodges leads high risk obstetrics (Perinatal Services) at Monash Health, and trained in fetal therapy in Belgium and Canada.

Ryan and his PhD student, Aidan Kashyap, are researching the effects of sildenafil administered to the mother during pregnancy to improve fetal lung function. Early results are promising and Ryan and Aidan plan to publish their results in 2018.

CDH Australia continues to work closely with the Ritchie Centre at Monash Health, and are planning to visit in the 2017-2018 financial year to meet the broader team to better understand the vital work they do and deepen our relationship.

Research into Long-term Cardio-Respiratory outcomes

Research is also being completed by Dr Jason Tan and his associates in Western Australian to assess the long term cardiorespiratory and psychosocial outcomes in CDH survivors. Children born with a congenital diaphragmatic hernia are at risk of breathing, growth and development issues as they are growing up. This team have recently completed a study in Perth (Western Australia) in collaboration with Princess Margaret Hospital and Telethon Kids institute.

The study has helped build understanding of long-term issues, assess the changes that may occur in the lungs as these children grow up, and guide future research to improve outcomes. In this study they found that children and adolescents born with a CDH were at risk of reduced lung function, issues with growth and reflux and some mild social and developmental issues. The children in the study were examined and subjected to a number of tests (lung function, cardiac echo, chest CT) to understand long term effects of CDH and guide follow-up programs for children born with CDH. The research will help evaluate other ways to improve health in children born with a CDH. Jason and his associated hope they can collaborate nationally to further improve outcomes of children born with CDH.
